เลือก/ระบุ และศึกษาคำศัพท์ ตำแหน่ง สถานที่ของวัตถุต่าง ๆ การสร้างประโยคคำถามเพื่อสอบถามรายละเอียดเพิ่มเติมตามสถานการณ์ การตั้งคำถาม ถามหาสิ่งของ บุคคล สถานที่ การให้รายละเอียดที่ชัดเจนของสิ่งของ บุคคล และสถานที่ได้อย่างแม่นยำ ศึกษาบทสนทนา คำศัพท์ สำนวนเกี่ยวกับเรื่องราวที่ประทับใจ โดยใช้กระบวนการทางภาษา และทำทางสื่อสารตามมารยาททางสังคมในการสร้างความสัมพันธ์ระหว่างบุคคล ชุมชน การขอข้อมูล การให้ข้อมูลความช่วยเหลือและบริการแก่ผู้อื่น การถ่ายโอนข้อมูลที่ได้ฟังโดยใช้ทักษะการพูด การอ่านออกเสียง คำ วลี สำนวนต่าง ๆ อย่างถูกต้อง ใช้ภาษาสื่อสารได้อย่างเหมาะสม ทั้งน้ำเสียง อารมณ์ คำศัพท์ สำนวน การแสดงท่าทางที่สอดคล้องกับบริบทและเป็นไปตามวัฒนธรรมของเจ้าของภาษาอย่างมั่นใจ เห็นคุณค่าของภาษาอังกฤษ สามารถใช้เป็นเครื่องมือแสวงหาความรู้เพิ่มเติม เชื่อมโยงและบูรณาการกับกลุ่มสาระอื่น เสริมสร้างคุณธรรม จริยธรรม และนำไปประยุกต์ใช้ในชีวิตประจำวันได้

ผลการเรียนรู้

2. สามารถปฏิบัติตามคำสั่งง่าย ๆ คำขอร้อง คำแนะนำ และคำชี้แจงต่าง ๆ จากที่เรื่องได้ฟังและอ่าน
3. แสดงความรู้สึก ความคิดเห็นต่อสถานการณ์ต่าง ๆ พร้อมทั้งให้เหตุผลประกอบอย่างเหมาะสม

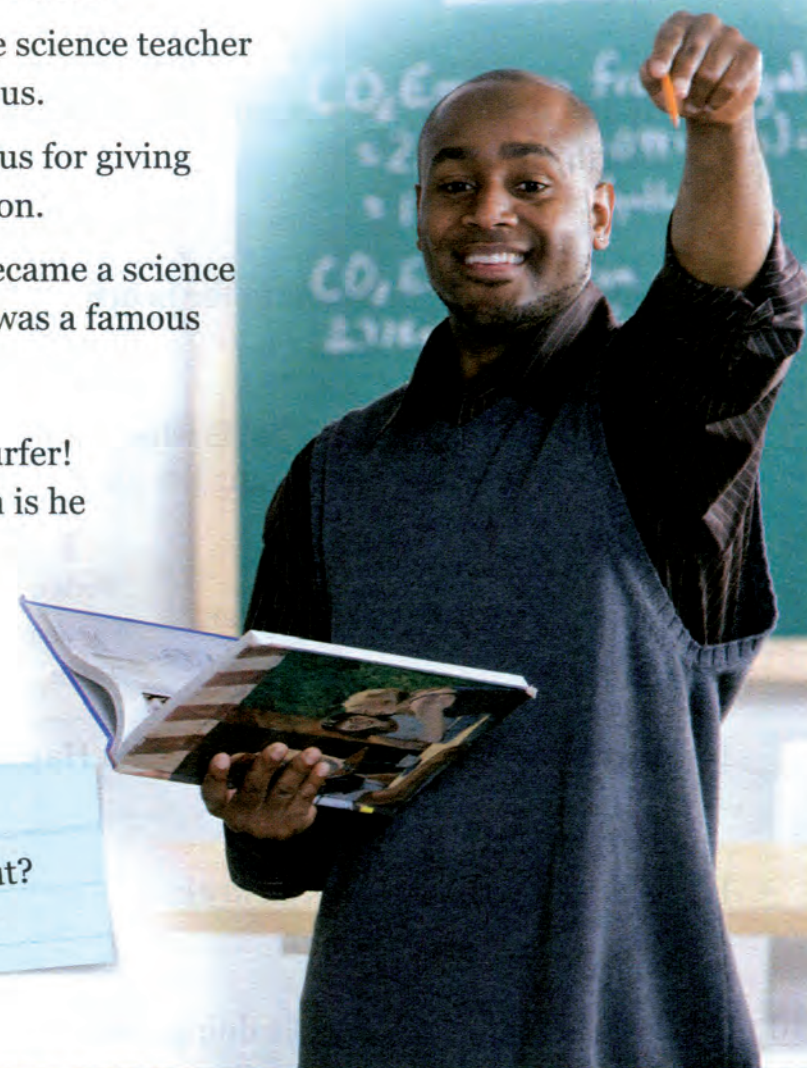

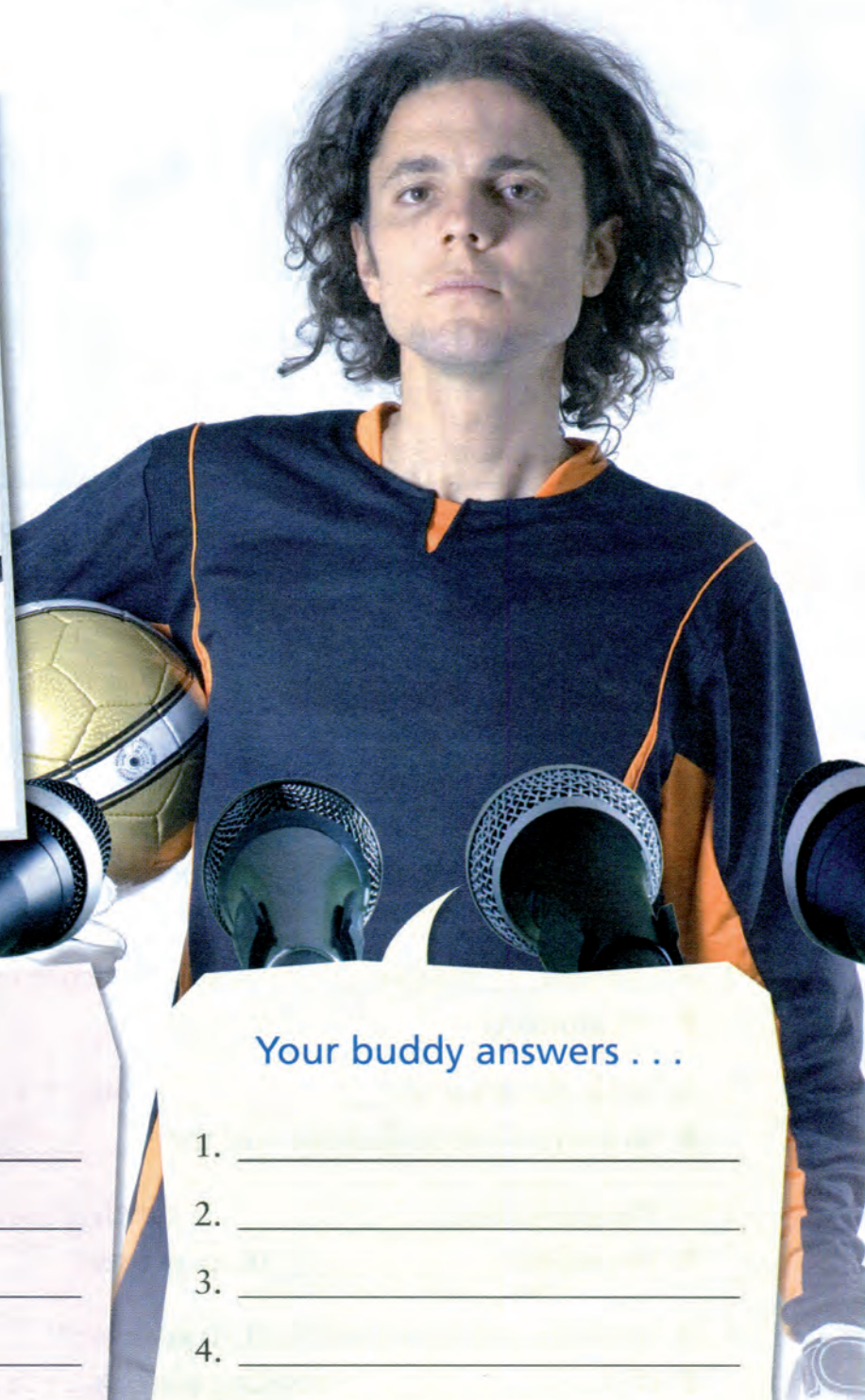

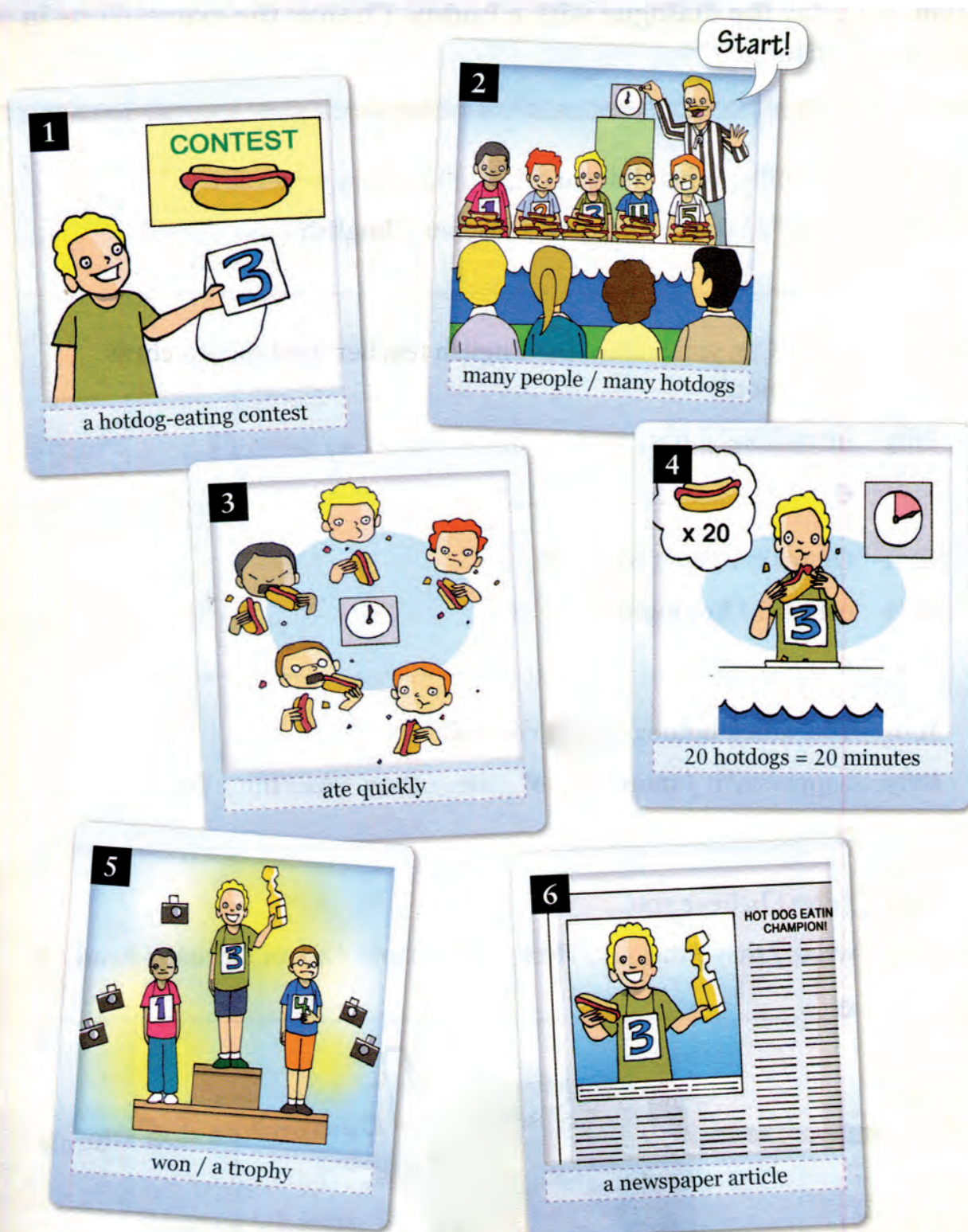
