watch TV in the evening.

Note: Frequency adverbs often come before the verb: I usually go to bed late.

Frequency expressions answer questions with *How often . . . ?*

Expressions of Frequency

every day.
three times a week.
twice a week.
once a week.

Gerunds as Objects of Verbs: like, love, hate, enjoy

Gerunds have the form verb + -ing. They can be used after some verbs.

I **like listening** to music. He **enjoys going** to the movies.

You **love** *dancing*. She hates *running*.

Note: Don't use *like*, *love*, *hate* in the present progressive to express likes and dislikes. Use these verbs in the simple present tense instead.

What Kind of Student Are You?
