Why are gold and silver expensive?

It's difficult to find gold and silver, but people want to use them to make lots of different things. So gold and silver are called precious metals. "Precious" means expensive and important.



Where can we find gold?

Gold is found all over the world. We can find pieces of gold in rocks. Most of the world's gold is in the oceans, but it's very difficult to get it from under the ocean. Sometimes, people look for gold in rivers.

They pick up small rocks in a pan with water in it. They move the pan quickly. Because gold is heavy, it falls to the bottom of the pan, and people can collect it easily. Gold can also come from gold mines underground. People use gold to make things like jewelry and parts of computers.

Can we find silver all around the world?
We can find rocks with silver in them in most countries. Artists make silver into jewelry.
Mexico makes a lot of silver jewelry. Silver can be used to make other things too, like coins and mirrors.
