How to Use This Book




Pre-Listening Warm-Up

In Parts B and C, students will practice more new vocabulary words by identifying words in context or additional vocabulary and definition matching exercises.




Listening 1, 2, 3

Listening 1, 2, and 3 take the vocabulary used on the warm-up page and deliver a dialogue or monologue based on the unit's theme. Exercise A is always a visual-based exercise to get students engaged in the listening as well as provide visual clues. Exercises B and C alternate between True and False questions, multiple choice questions, or fill-in-the-blank exercises. The various exercises target different thinking skills.




Speaking Practice


