Comparatives

Comparative adjectives are used to talk about the differences between two people, things, etc. Comparatives take the form: noun (subject) + verb + comparative adjective + *than* + noun.

Ex He is bigger than his brother. This car is more expensive than that car.

Intensifiers

Intensifiers can go with a comparative adjective to add detail about the size or degree of a difference. Common intensifiers include much, far, a lot, a little, quite a lot, etc.

EX He is much bigger than his brother. This car is a little more expensive than that car.


